Background

Communications entrepreneur and legacy legislator seeking to improve elections and fight climate change; ran to fill an open, deeply Democratic seat in the southern Bay Area

Early career centered on legislative service, working in his father's state Assembly office; also worked for Rep. Jackie Speier (D-CA) while she was serving as a state senator

Began his own multimedia production business in 2005, which primarily focused on public affairs programming
Elected to the South San Francisco City Council in 2007 and served briefly as mayor in 2011 before running for the California Assembly in 2012

Has served as speaker pro tempore of the California Assembly since 2014, which is the second ranking leadership position in the body; authored several key campaign finance reform bills and championed climate legislation through the lower chamber

Opted to run for Congress in 2022 to replace retiring Rep. Jackie Speier (D-CA), and received the incumbent's endorsement early in the race; won the all-party primary with 42 percent of the vote and faced Democrat David Canepa in the general election
